

RESOLUTION NO. 9-12-24-2

A RESOLUTION OF THE SANITARY DISTRICT COMMISSION OF BROWNS LAKE SANITARY DISTRICT, TOWN OF BURLINGTON, RACINE COUNTY, WISCONSIN, ESTABLISHING A SURCHARGE PURSUANT TO SECTION VII C. OF THE BROWN'S LAKE SANITARY DISTRICT CODE OF ORDINANCES.

WHEREAS, Section VII C. of the Brown's Lake Sanitary District Code of Ordinances authorizes the District to establish by Commission resolution a quarterly surcharge on any user failing to take action to properly prevent inflow and infiltration of groundwater to laterals or for other reasons as may be established by the District; and


WHEREAS, the purpose of the surcharge is to recognize that when the volume of wastewater contributed to the District's collection system by users of the District's wastewater collection system exceeds the anticipated volumes based upon the RUE assigned by the District due to the failure of such users to properly prevent inflow and infiltration of groundwater to laterals or for other reasons, the District incurs unnecessary treatment and other expenses; and

WHEREAS, the District has determined that unnecessary treatment and other expenses incurred by the District due to the failure of such users to properly prevent inflow and infiltration of groundwater to laterals should be borne, at least in part, by such users;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Sanitary District Commission of Browns Lake Sanitary District does hereby resolve that the quarterly surcharge authorized under the provisions of Section VII C. of the Brown's Lake Sanitary District Code of Ordinances shall be equal in amount and in addition to the quarterly user charges imposed pursuant to Section VII A. of the Brown's Lake Sanitary District Code of Ordinances.
